ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (Year B) 16th June, 2024

WE MAY NOT ALWAYS KNOW!

Seed is thrown on the land by the sower ..
“Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know” Mark 4:26-34.

So much of what happens in our life these days is played out publicly... we might imagine we don't have a private thought or a private aspect to our lives. However, just as is suggested in today's Gospel regarding the 'seed of faith' metaphor ... out of sight, what is planted in us will reap rewards at the time of harvest having being nurtured through the night's and days of our lives even when we were unconsciously providing the environment for it's nurture.

The environment of the depth's within each of us, is the most sacred of sanctuaries. Surely there lies the great incubator of the richness and goodness we are called to be, by Jesus, by the way we live our lives.



Oh that the second metaphor of today's Gospel could speak to our experience in our lives ... “a mustard seed which at the time of

sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet, once it is sown it grows in to the biggest shrub of them all and puts out large branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in it's shade.” Mark 4:26-34 (continued).

When a time of challenge comes our way, that we might discover the magnitude of what we might have imagined to be the tiniest faith seeds planted within ... and not just be a source of strength for self in a moment of difficulty .. But ... also a shade for another to shelter from a life's storm that has consumed them.

May the seed of faith grow in each of us reaching a bountiful harvest for self and others.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Mk 4:26-34

Jesus said to the crowds:
'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A
man throws seed on the land. Night and day,
while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed
is sprouting and growing; how, he does not
know. Of its own accord the land produces
first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain
in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he
loses no time: he starts to reap because the
harvest has come.

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom
of God is like? What parable can we find for
it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time
of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all
the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it
grows into the biggest shrub of them all and
puts out big branches so that the birds of the

air can shelter in its shade.'
Using many parables like these, he spoke the
word to them, so far as they were capable of
understanding it. He would not speak to them
except in parables, but he explained everything
to his disciples when they were alone.
