Prayer "It's a complete waste of time if you ask me"

In a way, you're not wrong. Prayer has been called "wasting time with God". And that's an apt description. It's a bit like people in love. If you ask lovers why they spend time together, they will probably say "well, we just like being together". They don't feel the need to be constantly telling each other things or even talking at all. They like being together just for its own sake. It's the same with prayer. At its heart prayer is a relationship. It is simply wanting to be with God.

Another thing people discover when they pray is that the initiative doesn't come from them. God isn't waiting for people to pray to him like someone at the other end of a telephone line. It's the other way around. The initiative comes from God. He is present to us at all times. He is to be found in this world in nature, in other people and at the deepest centre of our being.

When anyone prays they are opening themselves to the God who is already there

and who continually offers himself to them. People who seriously pray regularly cannot live on a trivial level. In prayer they explore the depth of their lives, they discover more clearly who they are and what their place in the world is.

In prayer they open themselves and unite themselves to the love which is the source of all reality and learn to share that love with others.

A reading from the first book of the Kings 1Kings 17:10-16

Elijah the Prophet went off to Sidon. And
when he reached the city gate, there was a
widow gathering sticks; addressing her he
said, 'Please bring a little water in a vessel
for me to drink'. She was setting off to bring
it when he called after her. 'Please' he said,
'bring me a scrap of bread in your hand'.
'As the Lord your God lives', she replied, 'I
have no baked bread, but only a handful of
meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug; I am just
gathering a stick or two to go and prepare
this for myself and my son to eat, and then
we shall die.' But Elijah said to her, Do not
be afraid, go and do as you have said; but
first make a little scone of it for me and
bring it to me, and then make some for
yourself and for your son. For thus the Lord
speaks, the God of Israel:

'Jar of meal shall not be spent,
jug of oil shall not be emptied,
before the day when the Lord sends
rain on the face of the earth'.

The woman went and did as Elijah told her
and they ate the food, she, himself and her
son. The jar of meal was not spent nor the
jug of oil emptied, just as the Lord had
foretold through Elijah.

to reward with salvation those who are
