First Sunday of Advent Year C 1st December, 2024

Advent is a Time to Prepare to Receive Jesus

The first Sunday of Advent we begin a new liturgical year. Advent is a time of preparation for the coming of the Lord, and one of the key themes of the season is watchful waiting. The season of Advent is a time of waiting, which traditionally is defined as preparation. Advent provides a wonderful opportunity to consider what is going on inside me, to reflect on the reason for our waiting: the arrival of Jesus, the arrival of love, in our hearts in ever-new ways.

A Season of Hope

During this season, we light the First Candle on the Advent Wreath, symbolizing hope. Hope is not merely wishful thinking; it is a confident expectation that God's promises will be fulfilled. In the midst of 'dark clouds over the sky', what gets lost is Hope- a hope in a better world, a hope in overcoming the situation, a hope in life and a hope in the lord. As messengers of Hope, we are called to be the salt of the earth and light of the world.

Slow Down To Silence the Distractions

In the busyness of our lives, it's easy to lose sight of the spiritual significance of Advent. Sometimes due to our weakness we lose sight of god and lose hope. It's a season which invites us to slow down, to silence the distractions, silence the unpleasant dreams and to turn our hearts and minds toward God's presence and also to wake from the slumber. Advent invites us to cultivate a spirit of

watchfulness, not just for the signs of Christ to return, but for the opportunities God places before us daily to grow in Faith, Hope and Love. And to be faithful servants.

As we embark on this Advent journey, let us take time to reflect on the state of our hearts. Have we become complacent in our faith? Have we allowed sin to create distance between us and God? Have we been into a deep slumber failing to see the need to help the others? It is a time to wake up, be watchful and be engaged in our God given responsibilities zealously.

This season offers us a chance to reset, to rekindle the flame of our devotion, and to recommit ourselves to a life of discipleship and wait eagerly like a faithful servant, for the birth of the Redeemer. As we light the first Candle of the Advent Wreath, let it symbolize the light of Christ illuminating our hearts and guiding us through this season of preparation without losing hope.




